


Choosing a location	Do not place the printer close to flammable solvents such as alcohol or thinners.
Power supply	Never attempt to plug in or unplug the printer from the power supply when your hands are wet.
	Always push the plug all the way into the power outlet.
	Never damage, modify, stretch or excessively bend or twist the universal AC adapter and power cord. Do not place heavy objects on the power cord.
	Never plug the printer into a power socket that is shared with other equipment (extension lead/cord, 2- or 3-way adapter, etc.).
	Never use the printer if the power cord is bundled or knotted.
	If you detect smoke, unusual smells or strange noises around the printer, immediately unplug the printer at the power supply and call for service.
	Periodically, unplug the printer and use a dry cloth to wipe off any dust or dirt collected on the plug and the power outlet. 



Cleaning the printer	<p>Use a damp cloth to clean the printer. Never use flammable solvents such as alcohol, benzene or thinners. If flammable solvents come in contact with electrical components inside the printer, it could cause a fire or electric shock.</p>  <p>Always unplug the printer from the power outlet before cleaning the printer. If you accidentally switch the printer on while cleaning it, you could injure yourself or damage the printer.</p>
Maintaining the printer	<p>Do not attempt to disassemble or modify the printer. There are no user serviceable parts inside the printer. The printer contains high-voltage components. Never attempt any maintenance procedure not described in this guide.</p>




Note

If preparatory operations below are not complete, follow your setup sheet to complete them.

- The Print Head and ink tanks are set into place.
 - The printer is connected to your computer (or a compatible device).
 - The printer driver is installed.

1 Open the Rear Tray Cover.

The Paper Output Slot Cover will open automatically.




2 Press the **Power** button.

The **Power** lamp flashes green, and changes to steady, non-flashing light.

Important

- If you use the battery, make sure that it is charged. For details, refer to the battery's instruction manual.
 - If the **Alarm** lamp begins to flash orange, see "Alarm Lamp Flashes Orange" on page 67.

3 Turn on your computer.




■ Turning off the Printer

- 1 To turn off the printer, press the **Power** button.

When the **Power** lamp stops flashing, the printer is turned off.

This takes a few seconds or as long as around 30 seconds.



Note

Auto Power Off Feature

You can set the printer to turn off automatically.

Set this setting in the **Maintenance** sheet of the printer driver in Windows®, and in the **Canon IJ Printer Utility** on a Macintosh®. For setting details, refer to the *PC Printing Guide* on-screen manual.

Important

When turning off the printer

Follow the procedure below to turn off the printer.

1. Confirm that the **Power** lamp on the printer has gone out.
2. Unplug the power plug from the wall outlet.

When you press the **Power** button to turn off the printer, the printer automatically puts a protective cap on the Print Head to prevent the ink from drying. If you remove the power plug before the **Power** lamp goes out, this capping will not be done properly, causing the Print Head to dry and clog.

If you stand the printer up or carry the printer before the Power lamp goes out, this may cause the ink to leak or the printer to break.

For information on the paper sizes available for each Canon genuine paper, visit our website. You may not be able to purchase some Canon genuine papers depending on the country or region of purchase. Paper is not sold in the US by Model Number. Purchase paper by name.

*2 If the corners or edges of the paper are smudged, try to print with the Paper Thickness Lever set to the left. It may improve print quality.
Reset the Paper Thickness Lever when you finish printing.
For details on the Paper Thickness Lever, refer to "Front View" in "Main Components" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.

*3 Proper feeding of paper may not be possible at the maximum capacity depending on the type of paper or environmental conditions (either very high or low temperature and humidity). In such cases, reduce the sheets of paper you load at a time to around half (around 0.1 inches / 2.5 mm in paper stack height).

*4 We recommend that you remove the previously printed sheet from the Paper Output Slot Cover before continuously printing to avoid blurs and discoloration.

*5 When loading paper in stacks, the print side may be marked as it is fed in or sheets may be stuck to one another causing them not to be fed properly. In this case, load one sheet at a time.

- *6 This paper cannot be used in Macintosh.
- *7 When printing photos to sticker paper from a mobile phone or PDA via infrared communication or Bluetooth communication, be sure to select **Sticker Paper** in **Paper Size** on the Canon Setup Utility. Refer to “Setting the Page Size, Media Type, and Layout When Printing from a Mobile Phone or a PDA” in “Printing through Wireless Communication” of the *User’s Guide* on-screen manual.

● **Media Types You Cannot Use**


Do not use the following types of paper. Using such paper will not only produce unsatisfactory results, but can also cause the printer to jam or malfunction. Additionally, when printing on A5 or smaller sized paper, do not use paper thinner than a post card, including plain paper or notepad paper cut to a small size.

- Folded, curled, or wrinkled paper
- Damp paper
- Paper that is too thin (weighing less than 17 lb / 64 gsm)
- Paper that is too thick (plain paper, except for Canon genuine paper, weighing more than 28 lb / 105 gsm)
- Picture postcards
- Postcards affixed with photos or stickers
- Paper that is not rectangular
- Paper bound with staples or glue
- Paper with adhesives
- Paper decorated with glitter, etc.


■ Loading Paper

Important

- You cannot print on postcards affixed with photos or stickers.
- Always load paper in portrait orientation (A). Loading paper in landscape orientation (B) can cause the paper to be jammed.



When Printing on Plain Paper

- You can use general copy paper or Canon's Super White Paper. When printing on both sides, we recommend Canon's Super White Paper Double-Sided.
Paper size:
 - Standard sizes: A4, B5, A5, Letter, and Legal
 - Non-standard sizes: 2.13 x 3.39 inches to 8.5 x 23 inches / 54.0 x 86.0 mm to 215.9 x 584.2 mmPaper weight: 17 to 28 lb / 64 to 105 gsm (non-Canon genuine plain paper)
- If you cut plain paper to 4" x 6" / 101.6 x 152.4 mm, 5" x 7" / 127.0 x 177.8 mm, or 2.13" x 3.39" / 54.0 x 86.0 mm (credit card-size) for a trial print, it can cause paper jams.
- 100% recycled paper can be used.



1 Flatten the four corners of the paper before loading it.




Note

- Align the edges of paper neatly before loading. Loading paper without aligning the edges may cause paper jams.
- If paper is curled, hold the opposing curled corners and gently bend them in the opposite direction until the paper becomes completely flat. See "Paper is curled." on page 63.
- To avoid curling, handle paper as follows.
 - When you are not using the printer, remove paper from the Rear Tray, and put unused paper back into the package and keep them on a level surface.
 - Take out only the necessary number of sheets from the package, just before printing.

2 Prepare to load paper.

- (1) Open the Rear Tray Cover.
The Paper Output Slot Cover will open automatically.
- (2) Pull out the Paper Support completely until the  mark and the  mark are aligned.
- (3) Adjust the position of the Paper Thickness Lever.
The Paper Thickness Lever switches the clearance between the Print Head and the loaded paper to match the media type.
Set it to the left when printing on envelopes or T-shirt transfers, and right when printing on any other type of the paper.




Note

If the corners or edges of the paper are smudged, try to print with the Paper Thickness Lever set to the left. It may improve print quality.
Reset the Paper Thickness Lever to the right when you finish printing.

3 Load the paper.

- (1) Slide the Paper Guide to the left side of the Rear Tray.
- (2) Load the paper in the Rear Tray with the print side facing UP.
- (3) Align the paper stack against the guide on the right side of the Rear Tray.
- (4) Slide the Paper Guide against the left side of the paper stack.
Do not slide the Paper Guide too strong. Paper may not be fed properly.



* Do not load higher than the projection (A).

4 Specify the page size and media type settings according to the loaded paper.

Note

Select the size and type of the loaded paper in **Page Size** (or **Paper Size**) and **Media Type** in the printer driver.
For details on printer driver settings, see "Printing with Windows" on page 18 or "Printing with Macintosh" on page 19.

■ Loading Envelopes

Use either European DL or US Comm. Env. #10-sized envelope.

With proper printer driver settings, the address will be printed according to the direction of envelope.


❗ Important

Do not use the following envelopes:


- Envelopes with a double flap (or sticker flaps)
- Envelopes with an embossed or treated surface
- Envelopes with pressure seals
- Envelopes whose gummed flaps are already moistened and adhesive

1 Prepare the envelopes.


- Press down on all four corners and edges of the envelopes to flatten them.



- If the envelopes are curled, hold the opposite corners and gently twist them in the opposite direction.



- If the corner of the envelope flap is folded, flatten it.
- If the leading edge of an envelope is puffed up or curled, use a pen to press the envelope flat and sharpen the crease. Press the envelope flat, working from the middle to the edge.




* The above illustrations show a side view of the leading edge of the envelope.

❗ Important

- The envelopes may jam in the printer if they are not flat or the edges are not aligned.
- Make sure that no curl or puff exceeds 0.1 inches / 3 mm.

2 Load the envelopes.

- (1) Slide the Paper Guide to the left side of the Rear Tray.
- (2) Load the envelope against the guide on the right side of the Rear Tray. Load with the address side facing UP and the rear flaps DOWN on the left. Up to 10 envelopes can be loaded at once.
- (3) Slide the Paper Guide against the left side of the envelope.
Do not slide the Paper Guide too strong. Paper may not be fed properly.
- (4) Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the left.
Reset the Paper Thickness Lever to the right when you finish printing.

(B) Make sure the flaps are folded.

3 Specify the settings in the printer driver.

- (1) Select **Envelope** in **Media Type**.
- (2) Select the size for envelopes.
In Windows, select **DL Env.** or **Comm. Env. #10** in **Page Size**.
In Macintosh, select **DL Envelope** or **#10 Envelope** in **Paper Size**.
- (3) Select **Landscape** in **Orientation**.



Important

Be sure to set the printer driver setting properly. If you do not, the address will be printed in the wrong direction.




You can use 4" x 6" / 101.6 x 152.4 mm, 5" x 7" / 127.0 x 177.8 mm, and Credit card-sized papers.

Always load paper in portrait orientation (A). Loading paper in landscape orientation (B) can cause the paper to be jammed.





- (3) Slide the Paper Guide against the left side of the paper stack.
Do not slide the Paper Guide too strong. Paper may not be fed properly.
- (4) Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the right.



2 Specify the page size and media type settings according to the loaded paper.






Printing Photographs Directly from a Compliant Device

You can connect a PictBridge compliant device such as a digital camera, camcorder, or mobile phone using a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer, and print recorded images directly without using a computer.

● Connectable Devices

PictBridge is an industry standard enabling a range of digital photo solutions, including the direct printing of photos from a digital still camera, camcorder or mobile phone* without the need to use a computer. A device can be connected to this printer for direct printing regardless of the manufacturer or the model as long as it complies with the PictBridge standard.

* PictBridge compatible digital still cameras, digital camcorders, and camera-equipped mobile phones are hereafter collectively referred to as "PictBridge compliant device".



A device with this mark is PictBridge compliant.

● Printable Image Data Format

This printer prints images taken with a DCF (Design rule for Camera File system) ver. 1.0/2.0-compatible digital camera (Exif ver. 2.2/2.21 compliant), as well as PNG files.

Printing Photographs Directly from a Compliant Device

To connect a PictBridge compliant device to this printer, use a USB cable recommended by the device's manufacturer.

Caution

Do not connect any equipment other than PictBridge compliant devices or the optional Bluetooth Unit BU-30 to the Direct Print Port of the printer. If you do so, electric shock, fire, or damage to the printer could result.

Important

Never disconnect the USB cable during printing unless when explicitly allowed to by the PictBridge compliant device. When disconnecting the USB cable between the PictBridge compliant device and printer, follow the instructions given in the device's instruction manual.

Note

When printing photos with the PictBridge compliant device connected to the printer, we recommend the use of the AC adapter supplied with the device. If you are using the device battery, be sure to charge it fully.


2 Connect the PictBridge compliant device to the printer.


Note

Depending on the model or brand of your device, you may have to select a print mode compliant with PictBridge before connecting the device. You may also have to turn on the device or select Play mode manually after connecting the device to the printer.

Perform necessary operations on the PictBridge compliant device before connecting it to this printer according to instructions given in the device's instruction manual.

- (1) Make sure that the PictBridge compliant device is turned off.
- (2) Connect the PictBridge compliant device to the printer using a USB cable recommended by the manufacturer of the device.
The device turns on automatically.
If your device does not turn on automatically, turn it on manually.



- (3) Set up the PictBridge compliant device for direct printing.
 will appear on the LCD of the device when the printer is correctly connected.

About PictBridge Print Settings

■ Settings on a PictBridge Compliant Device

This section describes the print settings on a PictBridge compliant device. When operating the device, be sure to follow the instructions given in the instruction manual of your PictBridge compliant device.

Note

- In the following description, names of setting items are given according to those used in Canon-brand PictBridge compliant devices. Setting item names may be different depending on the brand or model of your device.
- Some setting items explained below may not be available on some devices.
When you cannot change print settings on a device, the printer prints images as follows:
 - Paper size: 4" x 6" / 101.6 x 152.4 mm
 - Paper type: Photo
 - Layout: 1-up, Borderless
 - Date/File No. Print: Off (not printed)
 - Image Optimize: On (the shooting information will be used for optimized printing)

● Paper size and Paper type Settings

The following sizes and types of printing paper can be used when printing from a PictBridge compliant device.

^{*1} Can be selected only on certain Canon-brand PictBridge compliant devices.

^{*2} May appear as "Hi-Vision" on a non Canon-brand PictBridge compliant device.

^{*3} **Plain** can be selected for **Paper type** only when **Paper size** is set to **A4** or **8.5" x 11" (Letter)**. When **Paper type** is set to **Plain**, borderless printing will be disabled even when **Layout** is set to **Borderless**.

^{*4} You may not be able to purchase some Canon genuine papers depending on the country or region of purchase.

^{*5} When printing on 8" x 10" / 203.2 x 254.0 mm paper, select **8" x 10" / 20 x 25 cm** for **Paper size** and **Default** for **Paper type**.

*6 Exclusively used to print photo stickers. When printing on sticker paper, select **4" x 6"/10 x 15 cm** in **Paper size** and **Photo** for **Paper type**. Do not set **Layout** to **Borderless**.

● Layout Setting

Various layout options are available.

- Bordered/Borderless: You can select whether or not to print an image with a border.

- N-up: You can use this option when printing on sticker paper, or A4- or Letter-sized paper.

Sticker paper: When you select **4" x 6"/10 x 15 cm** for **Paper size**, you can print 16 images on a single sheet of paper.

A4 or Letter-sized paper: When you select **A4** or **8.5" x 11" (Letter)** for **Paper size**, you can print 4 images on a single sheet of paper.

- Shooting Info (Exif Data)*1: You can print shooting info (Exif Data) along with the image. The following two options are available.

1-up*2: Prints the shooting info (Exif Data) in the margin of selected individual images.

20-up*3: Prints 20 images specified with DPOF*4 and their shooting info (Exif Data) in list format on a single sheet of paper.

- 35 mm Film Style Layout (Contact Printing Layout)*1*3: You can print the multiple images specified with DPOF*4 in a list format that looks like a negative film.

Besides the above options, you can also specify to print an index of images in the DPOF print settings menu.

*1 Can be selected only on certain Canon-brand PictBridge compliant devices.

*2 You can use this option only when **4" x 6"/10 x 15 cm**, **5" x 7"**, **8" x 10"/20 x 25 cm**, **A4** or **8.5" x 11" (Letter)** is selected for **Paper Size**.

*3 You can use this option only when **A4** or **8.5" x 11" (Letter)** is selected for **Paper size**.

*4 DPOF (Digital Print Order Format) is a standard format to record the specified information regarding images, such as which image or number of copies to print.

● Date/File No. Print Setting

You can specify whether the date and/or file number will be printed.



Note

- If the images already have dates superimposed when shot, set this PictBridge setting item to **Off**. If you select **Date**, **File No.**, or **Both**, the date and/or file number will be printed over the date printed by the device's function.
 - Depending on the paper size and layout, the date will only be printed even when **Both** is selected.

● Image Optimize Setting

You can select the optimization method to obtain high print quality. When you select **On**, the shooting information is used to print the optimized image.

If you are using a Canon-brand PictBridge compliant device, the following additional options may be available, depending on the model.

- **VIVID** makes green and blue more lively.
- **NR** (Noise Reduction) reduces the noise on blue areas like the sky as well as on black areas.
- **Face** brightens a darkened face on the photo taken against the light.
- **Red-Eye** corrects red eyes in portraits caused by flash photography.

● Trimming Setting

You can select an area to print.

Routine Maintenance

When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect

When printing becomes faint or colors are incorrect even if ink remains in the ink tanks, the print head nozzles are probably clogged. Print the nozzle check pattern to confirm the condition of the nozzles and then perform Print Head Cleaning.

If print results are not satisfactory, performing Print Head Alignment may improve print quality.

 **Note**

Before performing maintenance

- Open the Print Head Cover and make sure that both lamps for the ink tanks are lit red.
If not, see “Getting the Ink Status Information” on page 43 and take the appropriate action.
 - Make sure that the ink tank is set properly. See “Replacing Ink Tanks” on page 45.
 - If the **Alarm** lamp flashes orange, see “Alarm Lamp Flashes Orange” on page 67.
 - Increase the **Print Quality** setting in the printer driver settings.

1. Make sure that the printer is turned on, and then load a sheet of the supplied paper (Paper For Print Head Alignment) or A4/Letter-sized Canon Matte Photo Paper MP-101 with the printing side (whiter side) facing up in the Rear Tray.
2. Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the right. For details on the Paper Thickness Lever, refer to “Front View” in “Main Components” of the *User’s Guide* on-screen manual.
3. Hold down the **RESUME/CANCEL** button until the **Power** lamp flashes green four times, and then release it immediately.

The print head alignment pattern is printed. Do not open the Print Head Cover while printing. The print head position is adjusted automatically when the print head alignment pattern finishes printing.

Replacing an Ink Tank

This section explains the way to confirm the ink status and the procedure to replace ink tanks. When ink runs out or other errors occur, the **Alarm** lamp flashes orange to inform you of the error. See “Alarm Lamp Flashes Orange” on page 67 and confirm how to handle it. When printing from your computer, error messages appear on your computer screen as well.

● With the Ink Lamps

You can confirm the status of each ink tank by the ink lamps. Open the Print Head Cover of the printer to confirm how the ink lamps light or flash.

● Ink lamp is on

The ink tank is correctly set and there is enough ink remaining to print.

● Ink lamp is flashing

Flashing slowly (at around 3-second intervals)



Ink is low. You can continue printing for a while, but we recommend you to have a new ink tank available.

Flashing quickly (at around 1-second intervals)



The ink tank is empty. Replace it with a new one.

● Ink lamp is off

The tank is not set properly or the function for detecting the remaining ink level is disabled.

If the ink tank is not set properly, press the  mark on the ink tank until the tank clicks into place.





■ Replacing Ink Tanks

When ink tanks run out of ink, replace them using the following steps.

⚠ Important

Handling Ink

- To maintain optimal printing quality, we recommend the use of specified Canon brand ink tanks. Refilling ink is not recommended.
- Once you remove an ink tank, replace it immediately. Do not leave the printer with ink tanks removed.
- Replace empty tanks with new ones. Inserting partially used ink tanks may cause the nozzles to clog. Furthermore, with such tanks, the printer will not be able to inform you when to replace the tanks properly.
- Once an ink tank has been installed, do not remove it from the printer and leave it out in the open. This will cause the ink tank to dry out, and the printer may not operate properly when it is reinstalled. To maintain optimal printing quality, use an ink tank within six months of first use.
- Color ink may be consumed even when printing a black-and-white document or when black-and-white printing is specified. Color ink is also consumed in Print Head Cleaning and Print Head Deep Cleaning, which may be necessary to maintain the printer's performance. When an ink tank is out of ink, replace it immediately with a new one.

1 Make sure that the printer is on, and then open the Print Head Cover.

The Print Head Holder moves to the center.

⚠ Caution

- Do not hold the Print Head Holder to stop or move it.
- Do not touch the metallic parts or other parts inside the printer.

⚠ Important

If the Print Head Cover is left open for more than 10 minutes, the Print Head Holder moves to the right. Close and reopen the Print Head Cover to return the holder to the center.

2 Remove the ink tank whose lamp is flashing fast.



⚠ Important

- Handle ink tanks carefully to avoid staining clothing or the surrounding area.
- Discard empty ink tanks according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.





Important

 - Shaking ink tanks may cause ink to spill out and stain clothing or the surrounding area. Handle ink tanks carefully.
 - Be careful not to stain your clothes and hands with ink on the removed protective cap.
 - Do not reattach the protective cap once you have removed it. Discard it according to the local laws and regulations regarding disposal of consumables.
 - Do not touch the open ink port (C) once the protective cap is removed, as this may prevent the ink from being ejected properly.


4 Install the ink tank.

Important

- Install both ink tanks to print. The printer cannot be used unless both ink tanks are installed.
- If the front (innermost) part of the ink tank (A) is sticking up, push down on the Canon logo on the ink tank as illustrated below. Do not remove the ink tank forcibly.

- If the **Alarm** lamp still flashes orange after the Print Head Cover is closed, see “Alarm Lamp Flashes Orange” on page 67.
 - When you start printing after replacing the ink tank, Print Head Cleaning is performed automatically. Do not perform any other operations until Print Head Cleaning finishes. The **Power** lamp flashes green during cleaning.

Keeping the Best Printing Results

To avoid drying of the Print Head and clogging of the nozzles, note the following.

Note

- Ink may blur depending on the paper in the following cases;
 - Printed area is traced with a highlight pen or paint-stick, or
 - Printed area is stained with water or sweat
 - If the print head nozzles get clogged, printouts will become faint or particular colors will not be printed properly. For details, "When Printing Becomes Faint or Colors Are Incorrect" on page 24.
-

■ **When You Turn Off the Printer**

Follow the procedure below to turn off the printer.

- (1) Press the **Power** button to turn off the printer.
- (2) Confirm that the **Power** lamp has gone out.
This takes a few seconds or as long as around 30 seconds.
- (3) Unplug the power plug from the wall outlet.

When you press the **Power** button to turn off the printer, the printer automatically puts a protective cap on the Print Head to prevent the ink from drying. If you remove the power plug before the **Power** lamp goes out, this capping will not be done properly, causing the Print Head to dry and clog.

If you stand the printer up or carry the printer before the Power lamp goes out, this may cause the ink to leak or the printer to break.

■ **When You Are Not Using the Printer for a Long Time**

When you are not using the printer for a long time, print in both black & white and in color, or perform Print Head Cleaning, about once a month to prevent degradation of the Print Head.

Numerous nozzles are installed in the Print Head for high-precision printing. Just as the uncapped tip of a ballpoint pen or marker becomes dry and unusable if it is not used for a long period of time, the print head nozzles become blocked by dried ink. Periodically printing or cleaning the Print Head can prevent this blockage.

If you have not used the printer for a long time, print out the nozzle check pattern to check the print head condition before printing.

Cleaning Your Printer

This section describes the cleaning procedure that is needed to maintain your printer.

Caution

- Do not use tissue paper, paper towels, or similar materials for cleaning so as not to scratch the surface. Paper tissue powders or fine threads may remain inside the printer and cause problems such as Print Head blockage and poor printing results. Make sure to use a soft cloth.
 - Never use volatile liquids such as thinners, benzene, acetone, or any other chemical cleaner to clean the printer, as this may cause a malfunction or damage the printer's surface.
-

■ **Wiping Off Dirt on the Printer**

Be sure to use a soft cloth such as eyeglasses cleaning cloth and wipe off dirt on the surface with it gently. Smooth out wrinkles on the cloth if necessary before cleaning.

Caution

- Be sure to turn off the power and disconnect the power plug before cleaning the printer.
 - Do not use tissue paper, rough-textured cloth, or similar materials, as this may scratch the surface.
-

■ **Cleaning the Paper Feed Roller (Roller Cleaning)**

Clean the Paper Feed Roller if paper is not fed properly. Cleaning the Paper Feed Roller will wear the roller, so perform this only when necessary.


Note

Cleaning the Paper Feed Roller Without a Computer

The Roller Cleaning can also be performed without a computer, using the **RESUME/CANCEL** button.

1. Make sure that the printer is on, and then remove any paper from the Rear Tray.
 2. Hold down the **RESUME/CANCEL** button until the **Power** lamp flashes green three times, and then release it immediately.
The Paper Feed Roller will rotate as they clean. The **Power** lamp is flashing green while the Paper Feed Roller is rotating. The **Power** lamp is lit green when the Paper Feed Roller finishes rotating.
 3. Repeat step 2 twice.
 4. Make sure that the Paper Feed Roller stops rotating, then load three or more sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper in portrait orientation in the Rear Tray.
The roller cleaning requires three sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper.
 5. Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the right. For details on the Paper Thickness Lever, refer to "Front View" in "Main Components" of the *User's Guide* on-screen manual.
 6. Hold down the **RESUME/CANCEL** button until the **Power** lamp flashes green three times, and then release it immediately.
The paper cleans the Paper Feed Roller as it feeds through the printer.
 7. Repeat step 6 twice.
If the problem is not resolved, turn off the printer, unplug the power plug, and then wipe the Paper Feed Roller located on the right side inside the Rear Tray with a moistened cotton swab or the like. Rotate the roller manually as you clean it. Do not touch the roller with your fingers; rotate it with the cotton swab. If this does not solve the problem, contact your Canon Service representative.



■ Cleaning the Inside of the Printer

If the printed paper is smudged, the inside of the printer may be dirty.

To always get best quality printing result, periodical cleaning of the inside of the printer is recommended.

● Cleaning with the Printer Driver (Bottom Plate Cleaning)

This section describes how to clean the inside of the printer. If the inside of the printer becomes dirty, printed paper may get dirty, so we recommend performing cleaning regularly.

Note

Cleaning the Inside of the Printer without a Computer

The Bottom Plate Cleaning can also be performed without a computer, using the **RESUME/CANCEL** button.

1. Prepare two sheets of A4 or Letter-sized plain paper.
2. Make sure that the printer is on, and then load only one sheet of paper in the Rear Tray.
3. Fold the other paper in half widthwise, and then unfold it.
4. Load the paper folded in step 3 on the paper loaded in step 2.
Load the paper folded in step 3 with the open side facing up.
5. Set the Paper Thickness Lever to the right. For details on the Paper Thickness Lever, refer to “Front View” in “Main Components” of the *User’s Guide* on-screen manual.
6. Hold down the **RESUME/CANCEL** button until the **Power** lamp flashes green five times, and then release it immediately.





Print Results Not Satisfactory

If the print result is not satisfactory such as white streaks, misaligned lines, and uneven colors, confirm the paper and print quality settings first.

● **Check 1: Do the page size and media type settings match the size and type of the loaded paper?**

When these settings are incorrect, you cannot obtain a proper print result. If you are printing a photograph or an illustration, incorrect paper type setting may reduce the quality of printout color. Also, if you print with an incorrect paper type setting, the printed surface may be scratched. In borderless printing, uneven coloring may occur depending on the combination of the paper type setting and the loaded paper.

● **Check 2: Did you set the print quality setting appropriately?**

Select a print quality option suitable to the paper and image for printing. If you notice blurs or uneven colors, increase the print quality setting and try printing again.

* You cannot change the print quality setting when printing from a wireless communication device or PictBridge compliant device. (You may change the print quality setting with some Bluetooth devices.)

The method to confirm the paper and print quality settings differs depending on what you do with your printer.






Paper not loaded properly. 
